
NEW YEAR PRAYER

Coming into a new year, people make all kinds of resolutions for the next year. From trying to be healthier, better time management, life and work goals, and a host of other changes people look to have in their lives. Spiritually you may be wanting to spend more time with God or to serve God's kingdom through the life of the church or to volunteer with charity groups that help people. John Wesley had a Covenant Prayer that he would pray for the new year as a commitment to being open to growing spiritually for God and the Kingdom of God. Wesleyan's Covenant Prayer goes like this:

I am no longer my own, but thine.
Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.
Put me to doing, put me to suffering.
Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee.
Let me be full, let me be empty.
Let me have all things, let me have nothing.
I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal.
And now, O glorious and blessed God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it.
And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

Wesley's prayer is a reminder of the Covenant relationship we have with God through Jesus Christ saving grace. He starts by acknowledging humbly that we belong to God and that God will connect us where we need to be in life. God will put us to doing things for his Kingdom and that sometimes those tasks in life might be hard. At times God might not use us for certain ministries but that we should discern through the Holy Spirit where we can serve in ministries and where we can use our Spiritual Gifts to serve God and others. There is a humbling tone to Wesley's Covenant Prayer that we might have all things and nothing at times in our lives but that we would know God's joy in all circumstances of life. In all things in life to yield to God and to glorify God in all aspects of life. I encourage you to pray Wesley's covenant prayer throughout this new year and be open to seeing where God uses you in ministry or simply calls you to be in relationship with the Lord humbly praising him in the business of life and in the stillness of life this new year.


