

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

WE ARE EASTER PEOPLE

We are coming into the season of Lent that will start with Ash Wednesday and be forty days long. Ash Wednesday kicks off Lent and reminds us of our own human mortality. Going back to the book of Genesis we remember that God created us from dust and to dust we shall return or ashes to ashes.

In the season of Lent, we reflect upon our human condition and the flow of life from birth to death. As Christians in Lent, we more towards the new life we have in the spirit of Jesus Christ conquering death and bring new life through resurrection. Our Christian faith resides in the new life we have now and eternally through Jesus Christ saving grace and love that gives us eternal hope. We are Christian people that know that death has lost its sting, and Christ has the final victory over death and his love rules supreme.

Read this passage from Romans 6:5-11 NIV. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶ For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, ^{1a]} that we should no longer be slaves to sin—

⁷ because anyone who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸ Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. ¹⁰ The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. ¹¹ In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Our sins that have led to death have been taking away from Christ crucifixion on the cross and we have a new life now and for eternity. Not just in Lent or the Easter Season do we have this new life but always when we put are faith in Jesus's saving grace we are made a new. We are Easter People, and we will be exploring our resurrection

roots during Lent in a sermon series entitled "We Are Easter People". I invite you to come this Lenten Season to have a new abundant life in Christ and to say together that We Are Easter People!!
